Parks, Recreation, and Historic Preservation

The Fayle Road Bridge, located in Lake Pleasant, Hamilton County, is a steel pony truss bridge (with no overhead bracing) constructed in 1912 dating to the early period of standardization in bridge design. Per the New York State Department of Transportation's 2002 Historic Bridge Inventory and Management Plan (Mead & Hunt and Allee, King, Rosen & Fleming, Inc.), the bridge is eligible for the NRHP under Criterion C as it demonstrates a pattern of features common to a particular bridge type. The bridge is pinned, has a bridge plate, has wooden deck planking, and stone wing walls and abutments.

The bridge was last rehabbed in 1950.
